

There she goes again! As predicted in my press conference several weeks ago, my opponent has chosen to release lies and half-truths about Dameon Mosley’s case just as early voting begins. This is just another example of how the **Smith County swamp** operates. Let’s explore the facts.

Alicia’s Statement	Truth
“My opponent knew that Dameon Mosley had a criminal record.”	Dameon Mosley successfully completed deferred adjudication probation for his Henderson County misdemeanor possession of marijuana charge and was never convicted!
“Mosley had already demonstrated that he wouldn’t follow the rules even for a misdemeanor probation.”	Dameon Mosley’s alleged probation violations from his possession of marijuana charge were mainly related to non-payment of fees and were not related to reoffending. Mosley’s probation was never revoked by a judge for these alleged violations!
“Dameon Mosley had a warrant for his arrest for multiple probation violations from another county when my opponent made this dangerous plea deal”	Dameon Mosley had no outstanding warrants at the time of the plea deal for violating any terms of probation from other counties.

I want to be clear on the *actual* facts and timeline for Dameon Mosley:

- 1) On 5/12/2011, Dameon Mosley was placed on deferred adjudication probation for a **misdemeanor possession of marijuana** charge in **Henderson County**.
- 2) On 4/3/2012, the violation report identifying 9 alleged probation violations my opponent refers to in her video **was filed in reference to Dameon Mosley’s possession of marijuana charge! Dameon Mosley’s probation was never revoked by a judge!**
- 3) On 2/12/2013, Dameon Mosley successfully completed his deferred adjudication probation for the possession of marijuana charge **and was never convicted**.
- 4) Dameon Mosley confessed to his involvement in the robbery, which was acting as the lookout.
- 5) Dameon Mosley cooperated in identifying the actual aggressor, Kory Tave.
- 6) Kory Tave, not Dameon Mosley, used a weapon. The weapon was a BB gun.
- 7) Dameon Mosley was instrumental in assisting law enforcement locate and apprehend Kory Tave.
- 8) Dameon Mosley agreed to testify against Kory Tave, if the case proceeded to trial.
- 9) **The Tyler Police Department chose not to arrest or present cases to the District Attorney’s Office in reference to Dameon Mosley’s involvement in any other robberies based on his cooperation and level of involvement in the robberies.**
- 10) On 3/25/2015, Kory Tave was sentenced to 20 years in prison.
- 11) On 3/27/2015, Dameon Mosley was offered 10 years of probation, **after consultation with Detective Dennis Mathews at the Tyler Police Department regarding Dameon Mosley’s cooperation.**
- 12) On 3/31/2016, after more than a year on Intensive Supervision Probation (weekly reporting), Dameon Mosley’s probation officer, **without my involvement or knowledge**, recommended decreased supervision due to Dameon Mosley’s progress and compliance with the conditions of probation. A judge granted the probation officer’s recommendation.

13) District Attorney Matt Bingham has been personally handling Dameon Mosley's pending capital murder case since 1/2017 with **direct knowledge** of the plea agreements I made in 2015 with Kory Tave and Dameon Mosley. **He has never once questioned my judgment regarding the disposition of these cases, based on the facts and circumstances that were presented to me at the time of the plea agreement.**

I am committed to the truth and to upholding the rule of law. My opponent and the good old boy network she represents will stop at nothing to spread misinformation about my exemplary record as a strong, tough prosecutor because they hate the changes I have pledged to make in the Smith County District Attorney's Office and at the courthouse.
